Foreword from the President

Dear friends, sponsors and members of the University of Passau,

The academic year 2017–18 was all about our University's 40th anniversary, which we celebrated with a big weekend festival in June 2018 and at the Dies academicus, on 9 November, as the last festivity of our anniversary year.

Forty years ago, in 1978, the University started out with a few dozen staff and just a few hundred students, sent here, to the border region between Austria, the Czech Republic and Germany, by the central university admissions body for Germany. By the year 2025, we expect to grow to approximately 15,000 students and 1,500 staff in academic and support functions. We are preparing for this by positioning the University of Passau accordingly in terms of the disciplines represented here and by implementing suitable policies in the areas of finance, organisational structure, personnel – and not least by expanding the University's physical space capacities.

Having received, in September 2018, the full approval of the competent state ministries for our application for an extension of the campus onto to the former premises of the Lowenbrau brewery, we will now expand our built environment at the same time as we grow figuratively into a world-class university. On the Spitzberg site, the 'Passau International Centre of Science and Research' will be established, bringing the University as a centre of excellent, competitive research and strong, innovative teaching closer to the city centre of Passau and creating a gateway to Passau as a city of science. The premises will also be an important place of music and culture, for which we are very grateful to the Free State of Bavaria.

The basis for all our efforts is the University Development Plan, which was adopted by the Extended University Executive with the support of all member groups of the University in the summer semester of 2018. With this, will being negotiations with the Bavarian State Ministry of Science and the Arts for the next round of target agreements, which represent a great opportunity to set the course for the future development of the University of Passau.

In order to meet future social challenges, the University is committed to fostering diversity in research and teaching.

Times Higher Education Ranking 2018

In the Times Higher Education World University Ranking for 2018, the University of Passau came up among the 20% best universities. As a newcomer, we ranked 27th out of the best 250 'young' universities (under 50 years of age) in the Young Universities Ranking 2018, reaching third place in Germany.

University Executive

The University Council elected Professor Daniela Wawra as Vice President for Study, Teaching and Internationalisation in 2018. Together with Vice Presidents Jörg Fedtke, Harry Haupt and Harald Kosch, who were re-elected for another term, she has been supporting University President Carola Jungwirth in the University Executive since 1 April 2018.

Supervision Agreement and General Doctoral Regulations

With the doctoral supervision agreement, which the Senate adopted in the winter semester 2017–18, the University of Passau wishes to contribute to a fair and quality-led doctoral qualification phase for researchers. Subsequently, in summer semester 2018, the General Doctoral Degree Regulations were adopted.

Digital research magazine

The digital research magazine, which will go online in winter semester 2018–19, will highlight outstanding research projects that strengthen the university's strategic orientation on the internet. This online platform will make use of current trends in science communication and present selected projects in a journalistic style.


Research & Support for Early Career Researchers

University Development Plan

In the summer semester of 2018, the Extended University Executive adopted a new university development plan, which will remain in effect until 2022. The plan outlines the following central aims:

- The University wishes to make a significant contribution to solving current and future challenges as an internationally visible and attractive Bavarian university for Europe.
- The promotion of excellent research as well as the creation of excellent conditions for study and work particularly for our students and early career researchers is a top concern for the University of Passau.


Intake of external funds over time (EUR '000)



Teaching & Study

Degree programmes

Through its four faculties, the University of Passau offers a total of 39 degree programmes. Those studying at the University of Passau have access to the Language Centre's first-rate subject-specific language tuition and the Centre for Careers and Competencies's job market preparation courses.

Bachelor's degrees

Our 15 undergraduate programmes conclude with a Bachelor of Arts (B.A.), Bakkalaureus/Bakkalaurea Artium (B.A.), Bachelor of Education (B.Ed.) or Bachelor of Science (B.Sc.).

Studying abroad

The University has 236 partner universities in Europe and throughout the world, giving students the opportunity to gain valuable international experience as they study towards their degree.

Double degree programmes

The University maintains 19 double degree programmes with international partner universities.

New partner university in France

A new cooperative partnership has been established with Université Catholique de Lille (Paris – Issy-Les-Moulineaux campus). The agreement provides for staff and student exchanges under the Erasmus framework and establishes a new binational, trilingual master's programme in Business Law to be studied by professionals while in employment.

Teaching & Study

Master's degrees

Our 19 master's programmes are open those with a relevant undergraduate degree (e.g. bachelor's, Diplom, state examination or Magister), and lead to the degree of Master of Arts (M.A.), Master of Science (M.Sc.) or Master of Education (M.Ed.).

Programmes concluding with a state examination

Five degree programmes prepare our students for a state examination: the Teacher Education Programmes and the Undergraduate Law Programme.


Certificate programmes

Two certificate programmes have been established in the field of entrepreneurship, which are aimed at students and doctoral students of all faculties and are funded by the Bavarian State Ministry of Education, Science and the Arts through the Zentrum Digitalisierung. Bayern (ZD.B) platform.

Doctorates

Upon completion of any of the master's programmes – or even a bachelor's programme with very good grades – students can follow up with doctoral study.


Numerous organisations support students and doctoral researchers at the University of Passau through a variety of scholarship programmes. This includes the European Union, the Federal Ministry of Education and Research, the Bavarian State Ministry of Education, Science and the Arts, the support associations of the University of Passau, foundations and other institutions as well as support received under the Bavarian Equal Treatment Act.

International students

In 2017, a total of 1,493 international students from 106 countries studied on our campus. The University has registered a sustained strong increase in students from Asian countries.

Funding lines and programmes (selection)

German Academic Exchange Service (DAAD)

177 students and graduates and 11 academics from Germany and abroad received scholarships or fellowships from the DAAD. This puts the University of Passau in 30th place among the 100 DAAD member universities in Germany and in 4th place in Bavaria. For internationalisation projects and programmes such as Erasmus+, PROMOS, Welcome and Integra, the University received a total of 1,599,796 euros in funding.

German Courses Passau

German Courses Passau counted 138 participants in their Academic German Year, Academic German Semester and summer courses programmes, helping them to gain the German language skills required to study in Germany.

iStudi Coach


The iStudi Coach provided one-on-one advice to 170 international degree-seeking students from 59 countries on job search, the job application process, study organisation as well as administrative and legal matters.

Refugee Programme

50 refugees took part in an intensive higher-education preparatory programme to allow them to meet the requirements for studying at the University of Passau or at other German higher education institutions. 14 of those who graduated from the Refugee Programme have meanwhile begun their studies in Passau, and four of them are currently studying towards a master's degree.

EXIST entrepreneurship scholarships

- The Federal Ministry for Economic Affairs and Energy awards EXIST entrepreneurship scholarships for innovative technology-focused start-ups.
- Three teams (nine persons overall) from the University of Passau received EXIST entrepreneurship scholarships in 2017 and 2018, totalling 356,500 euros.

Awards (selection)

- Having made it to the finals of the 58th Philip C. Jessup Moot Court Competition 2017, Passau's budding lawyers achieved yet another international competition success: At the renowned Willem C. Vis Moot Court held in Vienna from October 2017 till the end of March 2018, the team from Passau reached the quarter-finals for the first time.
- The Law Clinic received an award from Chancellor Angela Merkel for its services to society in the StartSocial federal competition. The award ceremony took place in the Federal Chancellery in Berlin.
- The 'Regiothek' project, a spin-out of the University of Passau, was one of the winners of the nationwide 'Digital Innovations' start-up competition organised by the German Federal Ministry for Economic Affairs and Energy. This consumer platform was the only start-up business from Lower Bavaria to receive an award at the IFA trade show in Berlin.

Funding and cooperative partnerships (selection)


- The University Consortium for Knowledge Transfer and Innovation in Eastern Bavaria (TRIO) has commenced signing the cooperation agreements with its associated partners. The consortium is one of the largest funded projects in the 'Innovative University' federal-state program, receiving in excess of 14 million euros from the German Federal Ministry of Education and Research. TRIO seeks to strengthen the knowledge and technology transfer activities between universities, businesses and society in the administrative districts of Upper Palatinate and Lower Bavaria.
- The University of Passau and the Passauer Neue Presse (PNP) newspaper will cooperate even more closely in the training of journalists: a cooperation agreement was signed in summer semester 2018.
- The exhibition 'Nature Unleashed The Image of Catastrophe since 1600' at the Hamburger Kunsthalle, which ran from 29 June to 14 October 2018, was created in cooperation with the University of Passau. The project was curated by Dr Markus Bertsch, Director of the 19th Century Collection of the Kunsthalle in Hamburg, and Professor Jörg Trempler, who holds the Chair of Art History and Visual Culture Studies. In addition to the holdings of the Hamburger Kunsthalle, the exhibition featured more than 200 works from world-renowned museums and collections such as the Louvre and Musée d'Orsay in Paris, the National Gallery and the Victoria and Albert Museum in London, the Kunsthaus Zürich, the Kunstmuseum Basel and the Berlinische Galerie.

Student and staff structure (absolute numbers and distribution across faculties)




