CHARACTERISTICS OF **DIGITAL DEVELOPMENT** IN TRANSITIONAL DEMOCRACY

Myanmar as a Case Study

The public research colloquium will present the findings of a research on digital authoritarianism conducted by Dr. Nwet Kay Khine, a Fellow of the Passau International Centre for Advanced Interdisciplinary Studies.

Dr. Khine will discuss how the coup in Myanmar transformed the emancipatory potential of digital development to the tools of digital authoritarianism. Her research analyzes how a conflict state harnesses newly gained digital power for confronting citizens' protest and control freedom of expression by importing strategies from its digital enablers.
