WHO ARE WE LOOKING FOR?

- Be between the ages of 17-32 years old.
- Be able to demonstrate outstanding leadership experience and potential.
- Be passionate about sustainable development.
- Be willing to participate with an open mind when networking with persons from diverse cultural and social backgrounds, interests and ambitions.
- Be committed to be Humanitarian Affairs Green Ambassador for a one-year period.

WHAT WILL THE EVENT ENTAIL?

Delegates will have the opportunity to learn, be inspired and tackle the climate crisis head on. They will network with like-minded peers, world leading experts and event speakers. Then they can create their own sustainable projects through hands-on activities.

WHAT ARE THE FUTURE OPPORTUNITIES?

- The Green Summit allows students to approach studies from a more holistic, international perspective. Delegates will learn to draw connections, such as between climate change, poverty, inequalities and health. They will gain specific and subject-specific knowledge that will empower them when returning to their degree course or workplace. Delegates will also gain practical and transferable skills such as leadership, which will help to increase their future employability.

CHRISTIAN FLEMING DESIGN AND RENEWABLE ENERGY


When interviewing Cristian, he told us that his key advice for students is "Do what you do... but do it with purpose." Delegates will therefore learn that contributing to shaping a more sustainable world is not just the responsibility of scientists, politicians and entrepreneurs but also artists.

They will learn about global finance models for funding renewables, as well as how to become an activist and encapsulate creative tactics to make positive change.

GREEN ACTIVITIES

Reforestation of Indigenous Species

The Australian Wildfires of 2019 and 2020 are the turning point for many in their global green movement journey. Many have come to the realisation that forests around the world are suffering from the ever-worsening climate crisis. Students will now get a chance to implement practical and proven methods of forest restoration to bring nature back to life.





Mangrove Island Conservation

Who doesn't like themselves a cheeky monkey? As troops of monkeys swing through the most treasured Mangrove Forest Conservation Center in Samut Songkhram, delegates will plant mangroves on the island. With the vision of protecting the biodiversity of the forest, delegates will find the fruits of their labor come to fruition for years to come as monkeys live and reproduce better. As animal rescue has become a recurring theme for the environmentally conscious youth, this activity might be a dream come true for many avid animal lovers.

Marine and Coastal Conservation

This is a perfect opportunity for students to get their hands dirty and experience a career as an environmental conservationist. With the guidance of professionals, delegates will construct bamboo pipes that provide a stable habitat for corals, fishes and other organisms. These will then be placed on the sea bed by the Navy Seal Royal Thai Army. As delegates try to emulate and observe the laborious service of the naval force, this fulfilling activity comes as an opportunity for delegates to understand the importance of marine conservation as they plan for their careers of contribution in the years to come.



River Cleaning

Imagine your students kayaking with purpose. As they kayak along the river, they will be able to take in the passing scenery. Having come to appreciate the natural habitat, your students will take on the solemn duty of removing manmade litter in an attempt to restore river wildlife. During the journey, students might be able to spot traditional Thai houses and locals meandering along the coastline, allowing them to see the importance of safeguarding the aquatic fauna and flora to local communities.

THE PACKAGE

Venue: The Green Summit will be held at the United Nations Conference Center (UNCC) in Bangkok, Thailand. The UNCC serves as one of the headquarters for the UN Economic and Social Commission for Asia and the Pacific.

The registration fee is USD 1,200 + 7% VAT (tax) and includes:

The Green Summit gives young people the tools and knowledge to succeed in fighting for climate action and contributing to a greener future at home and in their place of work. This role is voluntary and a one-year self-directed initiative allowing delegates to serve in the promotion of sustainable development efforts in their own community. They will leave feeling empowered to instigate change, lead the way forward for other young people to ensure a green future and gain an interdisciplinary way of thinking.
