## Nurturing Sustainability: Embracing Nature, Land, and Cultural Heritage

#### Overview

The summer course is designed to discuss the close relationship of understanding the natural heritage of land, environment, and its relation to built form to achieve sustainability. This course will give you experiential learning with case studies in coastal Karnataka with a variety of natural ecosystems and a hub of natural heritage with high biodiversity index. These rivers cut through the 2-billion-year-old gneissic rocks that make up a part of the Western Ghats and the basement. The history starts with megalithic settlements, flourishing international trade from 2<sup>nd</sup> Century BC to development of present times. Today when we are grappling with various issues of climate change and sustainable development there are lessons to be learnt for all of us from this heritage. The exercises will help the student to appreciate the symbiotic relation between the geological landforms, natural heritage and built heritage of this region in lakes, mountains, rocks, and the sea.


