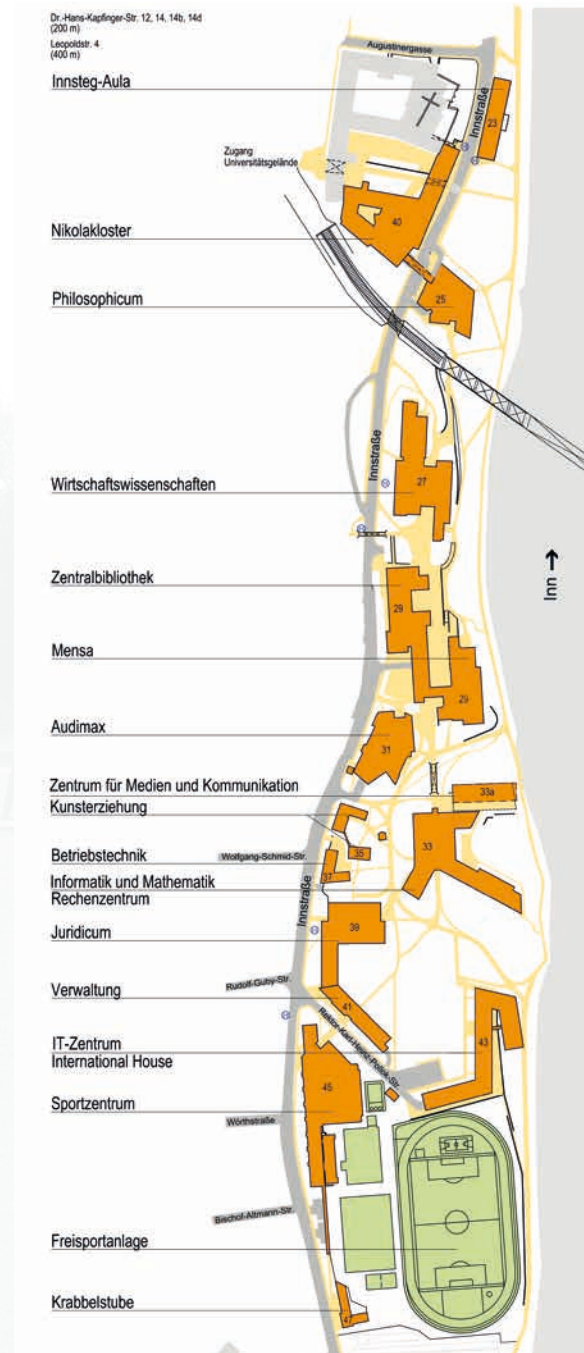

The Politics of History and Memory in Eastern Europe and Asia

The Politics of History and Memory in Eastern Europe and Asia

The end of the Cold War has led to shifts in the memoryscapes in countries in Eastern Europe and Asia.

This lecture series will show how at the backdrop of the changing world order since the 1990s memory and history are constantly rewritten and contested both in a national and transnational framework.

It will analyse the dynamics of history and memory in countries that witnessed the collapse of socialism on the one hand (Poland, Ukraine, Romania, and Kazakhstan) and the nominal survival of one-communist party role on the other (China, Laos, and Vietnam). Japan constitutes a special case, but here as well representations of historical memory underwent significant changes since the end of the Cold War.

General questions will concern the main actors of memory politics as well as the changes of the leading memory communities.

The papers will be presented by leading scholars in the field from England, Ukraine and Germany.
