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

Starts in	October (winter semester)

The M.A. Development Studies programme enables students to develop the advanced knowledge, analytical skills, and conceptual frameworks required to understand and navigate the complexities of economic and social development.

Students enrolled in the programme gain insights into the economic, social, ethical, and cultural contexts and constraints of development. The programme provides outstanding opportunities to put theory into practice through international field research, with a strong focus on integrating quantitative and qualitative methods.

ECTS credits and grades



ECTS: European Credit Transfer System

- Awarded in every course of studies (except: Law)
- 1 ECTS credit means a workload of 30 hours
 - 30 ECTS x 30 hs workload = 900 hs/ semester
 - 900/40 hs = 22,5 weeks of full-time work per semester
- In order to complete you studies in time, you should receive an average of 30 ECTS credits every semester.
- For every passed exam you receive:
 - A grade
 - ECTS credits (independent of the grade)

ECTS credits and grades



The German grading system


- In general: the smaller the number, the better
 - Pass: 1 ("very good") 4 ("sufficient")
 - Fail: 5 ("inadequate")
- Law: the bigger the number, the better
 - Pass:

18 ("very good") - 4 ("sufficient")

– Fail:

3 ("inadequate") - 0 ("insufficient")

Standard and maximum period of study



Standard duration, maximum programme duration

Standard duration (Regelstudiendauer):

The amount of time you need to complete your studies in general

Bachelor: 6 semesters

Master: 4 semesters

Maximum duration (Höchststudiendauer):

The amount of time you may need at most to complete your studies, e.g.*:

Bachelor: 8 semesters

Master: 6 semesters

- In some courses there are additional deadlines up to which you have to prove a certain number of ECTS → Leaflet!
- Please seek advice in good time, if you will exceed the standard period of study!

Lecture (Vorlesung: V/VL)

- Takes place in lecture hall
- Is mostly given by professors
- Students listen and take notes
- Questions can be asked
- No participant restriction and no compulsory attendance
- Type of exam: written exam
- Law: "Basic course"

Basic course (Grundkurs: GK)

- Similar to a lecture
- Introductory event
- Often smaller groups (not: law)
- Possible types of examination: presentation, written exam







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Seminar (Seminar: S)

- Proseminar (Proseminar: PS): during the first semesters
- Advanced seminar (Hauptseminar: HS): during higher semesters and in Master courses
- Small groups and group work
- Limited topics, new topics every semester
- Oral participation, discussions are welcome
- Type of examination: presentation, term paper (possibly written exam in proseminars)
- In addition: Master Class (MC), Oberseminar (OS), ...







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- Tutorial (Tutorium: TU)/ Exercise class (Übung: Ü)
 - Accompanies/supports the lecture or the basic course
 - In many cases students serve as lecturers
 - Exercises and repetition of the material from the lecture
 - Smaller groups
 - (Voluntary) homework with preparation and postprocessing
- Scientific exercise (Wissenschaftliche Übung: WÜ):

 types are varying, very often based on discussions and exercises,
 structure may resemble to a lecture or a (Pro-) seminar
- Advanced scientific exercise (Wissenschaftliche Übung für Fortgeschrittene: WÜF):
 prior experience; specific requirements to attend

We strongly recommend that you actively participate in exercise classes!







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"Kompaktseminar" (KS):

Free courses from the

- Examples:
 - Rhetoric and presentation
 - Time and self management
 - IT courses (Excel, PowerPoint, Photoshop, ...)
- Block events often on the weekend (1-2 days)
- Small groups
- Registration via Stud.IP
- Registration start: April 1 2023, 12 o'clock (first come, first serve!)







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Language Courses



Language Centre - Sprachenzentrum

- 15 languages to choose from
- Integrated into many courses of study
- All students can also take language courses voluntarily and for free (1-2 courses simultaneously are manageable)
- Oral participation, homework
- Usually compulsory attendance
- Exam: written exam, possibly oral exam

Placement tests are divided into the following three subject areas: Law, Cultural studies & Business and economics

Students of the Faculty of Computer Science and Mathematics or of a Teacher Education Programme should take the **English for Cultural Studies** test.

Types of courses



How each individual course takes place is announced in Stud.IP!

Face-to-face

- The course takes place in the lecture hall/seminar room.
- There is **possibly** an online broadcast or recording for students who cannot be there (= hybrid).

Hybrid

 You can follow the course online or in person. The teachers are responsible for the specific design.

Online

- The course takes place completely online.
- Synchronic = live at a specified time via Zoom, mostly weekly.
- Asynchronic = recorded teaching units that are uploaded to Stud.IP or ILIAS and that can be accessed there; sometimes feature some live dates

(Attention: add irregular appointments to your calendar!)

- The exam may still take place in person.
- Special case: VHB (= Virtual University of Bavaria)



Exams during your studies

Types of Exams

- "Klausuren": written exams, at the end of the lecture period
- "Referate": oral presentations, during the semester
- "Hausarbeiten": essays/papers, usually but not always written during the semester breaks
- "Mündliche Prüfungen": oral examinations, usually at the end of the lecture period
- Period of exams (especially written exams): 2 weeks in advance of the end of the lecture period until 3 weeks after the end of the lecture period.
- You will have to register for every exam!
- Use Campus Portal for registration or to sign off.

Campus Portal

- Registration and deregistration for exams and overview of grades
- Be careful about the examination number (Prüfungsnummer)!
 - You can find it in Stud.IP in the field "fields of study"
 - Sometimes it is also included in the module catalogue
 - The examination number in Stud.IP has to match the number in CampusPortal.
 - Also make sure to select the correct examiner!
- Examination numbers vary between the different versions of the study regulations:
 - Choose the current version at the start of your studies
